## **Scholarships**

Our Senators and Representatives will be returning to work, just as our students are returning to school. Please

contact our federal elected officials today and tell them to get ready for the school year with this *Congressional Back to School List:* 

1 - Update the flawed and out dated No Child Left Behind Act. 40 states now have waivers, but this is not a solution. The more responsible permanent fix is to authorize the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA).
2 - Close the legal gaps that allow bullying and harassment in schools. Some particular laws exist, but a comprehensive law is needed to eliminate the gaps. Students don't need to face the school year with relentless bullying - an atmosphere not conducive to learning for the victim, the perpetrator or the by-stander.
3 - Pass the Real Education for Healthy Youth Act (S. 372, H.R. 725). This will expand comprehensive sex education with effective, age appropriate, medically accurate programs. Students should have access to all necessary information about their bodies and health.

*Pay Gap Persists at the Top of the Corporate Ladder.* A new salary analysis from Bloomberg, of the 5 highest paid executives in 500 companies, shows that females on average still receive 18% less than their male colleagues. Please contact our federal elected officials on this issue.

*The Polaris Project* has rated all 50 states on their basic legal framework that combats human trafficking, based on 10 categories. 32 states now rate in the top tier with New Jersey and Washington having perfect scores of 10. Only South Dakota remains in the bottom 4th tier. Wisconsin moved up from 3rd to 2nd tier 2 years ago, scoring 5 out of 10.

*Contact our state legislators to improve the following:* 1 - provide training in human trafficking for law enforcement state wide.

- 2 mandate the posting of a human trafficking hot line.
- 3 provide a statute to grant immunity and divert sexually exploited minors from juvenile delinquency proceedings to child welfare services.
- 4 mandate the creation of a state wide victim services plan.
- 5 vacate convictions for prostitution from the record for sex trafficking victims.

# **Celebrating the Self Sufficiency Program**

Established in 1988, the Self-Sufficiency Program of the Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies at UW-L extends access to higher education to low-income single parents who are interested in attending college.



The success of SSP hinges on the commitment and active support of community groups such as AAUW-Self-Sufficier La Crosse Chapter, the La Crosse Women's Fund, PEO Program chapters, the funds of the La Crosse Community Foundation, and all the generous individuals who believe

that access to education should be available to all. The "Locally Grown Scholarship" fund has been established confident of these continuing commitments. . This fund provides support to SSP graduates who attend area colleges at least part time. Both modest and generous contributions have enabled us to provide a \$500 scholarship each semester; since 2004, we have provided 85 scholarships @ \$500 each.
