State of the Union Address

- President Obama's address was organized around 4 themes, and AAUW priority issues are imbedded in each: equal pay for equal work, paid leave, raising the minimum wage, work-family life balance, K-12 education policy, gender equity in STEM fields, voting rights and educational loan repayment.
- AAUW priorities not mentioned are violence against women (especially campus sexual assault) and access to reproductive health services and birth control.
