# **Art Fair Report**

Preliminary financials are in and once again, it looks as though we had another successful Art Fair. The revenue from the slightly lower number of artists was offset by the attendance. This year's gate receipts indicate that we had 3200 people attend in 2016 vs. 2600 in 2015. These figures combined with increased raffle and concessions revenue help to keep us in line. Almost all the bills are in and the good news is that the Grounds bill was a little less than 2015! We received some discounts that UW-L says will not apply in 2017, but we'll wait until next year to address that issue.

Adding to our income is the income that goes directly to the Scholarship Fund at the La Crosse Community Foundation. Those numbers are separate so that members and businesses contributing are able to claim the tax deduction, but are counted in the final tally of proceeds. Lois Gilbert has worked diligently to keep the numbers up to date.

Even though we can't take credit for the weather, we are all thankful that there were no storms, rains, cold, or extreme heat this year!

Thanks go to our great Art Fair Committee, members who volunteered their time, and all the non-members who graciously offered to help (or were "volunteered" by family members. A special shout out goes to our "garbologists" - Charlie & George). The art fair takes the efforts of many people and for that I thank you all.

If you have current appointment as an SRD and would like to be notified about LWV sponsored voter registration drives and outreach, send a message to Voter Service Committee at league@lwvlacrosse.org.

- 4) Election Monitors: LWV Wisconsin is seeking volunteer election monitors who will be trained and placed at the polls. You don't need to be a League member to volunteer! # **Public Policy**

#### Our media have been dominated this summer by 2 events - the Olympics and political campaigns.

We can be proud of many athletes that represented the U.S., and there is an increasing number of women in a variety of sports. But our news reporting still contains sexist remarks, reference to appearance and age, marital and parental status, just as with women in other areas of public life. Which media do you use? Please let them know when you see sexist reporting.

There are so many aspects of our campaigns and our democracy to think

**VOTING RIGHTS** changed when in 2013 the Supreme Court invalidated parts of the 1965 Voting Rights Act. As a result many states have created more restrictive voting laws - especially Wisconsin, North Carolina, Texas and North Dakota. These effect students, minorities, women, the elderly and disabled, and lower income citizens. There are promising decisions from U.S. Court of Appeals to turn this around.

**GERRYMANDERING** has limited the power of the ballot for minorities and lower socio-economic voters.

**VOTER REGISTRATION** has become more difficult with increased ID requirements, shorter time periods and fewer locations to register.

GOTV or GET OUT THE VOTE is something we are all responsible for as citizens. Do you know someone who hasn't registered? or someone who needs transportation or child care to get to the polls? or someone who isn't connected to non-partisan information about candidates?

VOTER EDUCATION - AAUW is a great resource through the website AAUW.org, Action Fund, Voter Issue Guide, and candidate positions. Information on candidates for U.S. President and Vice President, and an increasing number of Congressional and Gubernatorial races is available. PLEASE share this with neighbors, friends & family.

#### **COMMUNICATION WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS** - AAUW.

org, Action Fund, Two Minute Activist is a wonderful concise source of timely updates on legislation. The weekly AAUW Washington Update gives a broader view of what AAUW is doing in D.C. and around the country. Also, it provides news on issues affecting education, women and their families. In September 'AAUW in the Statehouse' begins a monthly E-bullitin, with a focus on state level issues and legislation. PLEASE sign up for all these e-mail connections during this important election cycle, and contact our legislators to express your views and concerns

Hearth & Home study group meets monthly to explore new ideas, culiniary experiences, fun activities and our area through visits to local businesses or in-home happenings.


Last spring there was interest in going on the LaCrosse Trolley tour sponsored by the Visitors Center in Riverside park.


- 1. I found AAUW at the 2015 Women's Day celebration at UW-L. I liked what I learned about the organization, its activities and its mission.


