Bev is a member of a mission team from First Presbyterian Church in La Crosse that makes an annual trip to Haiti. The team travels to the remote community of St. Martin. They set up a mobile clinic there and typically see between 150 to 200 patients per day.

Ruston has said Haiti is "a desperate place" because of the level of poverty and ineffectiveness of government to provide basic services like water, roads or health care.

Take Action! Tell Congress to Pass VAWA Now!



A bipartisan group of senators has just announced the reintroduction of the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA). VAWA was first enacted in 1994, but expired nearly 2 years ago. This important

legislation saved lives and dollars for many years. The Senate passed this bill in 2012, but the House did not, so we must renew our efforts. Let's keep the momentum going by urging our senators to cosponsor and vote for VAWA.

The automatic spending cuts have been delayed, but they are still dangerous. In the next two months, Congress will need to find a solution to avoid deep cuts to important investments such as education, funding for civil rights enforcement, women's health programs, and workforce training programs.

Your voice was critical in reaching this last deal; now it's time to finish the job. We'll let you know of key moments in the coming debate when we need to urge Congress to protect these important programs from sequestration.
