
Equal Pay Day, April 8

President Obama gave an exciting speech at a college in Florida recently, in the presence of some AAUW members and supporters. The President talked about equal pay, paid family and medical leave, access to higher education and increasing the minimum wage. (Increasing the minimum wage to \$10.10/hour would cut the wage discrepancy for females by 5 percentage points.)

President Obama's speech launched the White House campaign to draw attention to the needs of women and their families. The Department of Labor's Women's Bureau will hold a series of events - regional summits that will culminate in a 'White House Summit on Working Families' on June 23.

Equal Pay Day falls in the middle of this campaign on April 8. This is the date when the average woman's salary catches up to the average man's salary earned during 2013. This is an exciting effort, supporting several of AAUW's stands on issues that increase equity for women and girls and promotes education for all.

Daves explores how tensions over the maternal role have been part and parcel of the development of American society.




