AAUW's Public Policy Program is established every 2 years through our every-member vote process. This establishes federal action priorities and advocacy efforts. This process begins and ends with members.



First we complete surveys online or through everymember publications.

Staff recommends likely congressional action. The Public Policy Committee developes a proposed program based on viability, critical need and strong member support. A draft is posted online for comments and revisions. The final proposal is reviewed, amended as needed and apporved by the AAUW Board of Directors. This is returned to members for a vote.

The proposed 2013-2015 Public Policy Program can be found in the AAUW Outlook Magazine, Special Convention Issue. It also contains information on candidates for the Board of Directors - including our own Pam Thiel - and proposed Bylaws amendments.

The voting period is April 15-June 10.

Bras Needed!

Free The Girls (Freethegirls.org)

May is women's health month and Options Clinic is sponsoring many events/activities. One of these is for the Free the Girls non-profit organization. Their goal is to provide jobs to women rescued from sex trafficking. One way they do this is by collecting bras and giving them to these women to sell. A bra can be sold in other areas for up to 5 times the minimum wage! Therefore your old bras are worth a lot!

What's the problem?

Currently 27 million men, women and children are being held as slaves around the world—more today than in any other time in history. 80% of those slaves are women and girls. There are a number of amazing organizations that are helping to rescue these women out of a life of prostitu-

tion, but what happens after they are rescued?

What's our solution?

In Spring 2011, working alongside our first safe house partner, Project Purpose, freethegirls.org launched a pilot program in Mozambique, Africa. The results of the pilot



program were very promising—the women made 3-5x minimum wage selling bras.

By partnering with safe houses and after-care facilities, we provide an opportunity for women rescued from sex trafficking to earn a living selling second-hand clothing while going to school, getting healthy, and caring for their families. The women in our program receive their starting inventory as a donation, and are then able to buy additional inventory from Free The Girls for below wholesale value to help maintain their competitive edge on the marketplace. Revenue from inventory sales helps subsidize overseas program costs.

Why Bras?

Let's face it, ladies: the back of your underwear drawer is most likely a graveyard of bras you don't wear anymore or that never fit right in the first place. By contrast, second-hand clothing is a profitable market in many countries around the world. Bras are sought after items. And even better, bras provide an opportunity for these women to work with other women, since they have a history of being abused and used by men.

What can you do?

Donate your gently used bras by <u>bringing them to the May 4th meeting.</u> We'll collect them and give them to Options Clinic in Sparta where they will be donated to freethegirls.org. *Thank you for your "support"!*
