Equal Pay Progress, Federal and State

Seven years ago President Obama signed into law his first piece of legislation, the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act. Celebrating the anniversary, the president directed the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), in partnership with the U.S. Dept. of Labor (DOL), to annually collect summary pay data by gender, race, and ethnicity from businesses with 100 or more employees. The new proposal will cover over 63 million employees and provide critical insights into the gender and racial pay gap. It will help enforcement of equal pay laws and identify discriminatory practices across industries and occupations.

Gridlock and partisan bickering in Congress has stalled progress on the Paycheck Fairness Act. In response to the obstruction in Congress some individuals and state legislators have applied pressure. Over half of all states currently have some form of equal pay bill pending.

In Wisconsin we have lost equal pay legislation which had been established. AAUW and it's members need to keep up the pressure on state and federal levels. PLEASE LOOK FOR EVERY OPPORTUNITY TO COMMUNICATE WITH OUR LEGISLATORS AND GOVERNOR.

Congressional Voting Record (CVR)

I encourage you to check out the AAUW Action Fund Congressional Voting Record to see how our senators and representatives score on issues impacting women and families - equal pay, education, campus sexual assault, campaign finance, human trafficking, and reproductive rights. Hold the 114th Congress accountable and advocate for our priorities.

Note: Women in company leadership are tied to higher profits, says a new study of 22,000 publicly traded companies around the world. Yet, in the U.S., only 12% of board seats and 16% of executive positions are held by women. Important information to share!!
