Come to the Art Fair hungry this year. We will have new food vendors offering expanded food options. Our vendors will be Cowboy Kettle Korn, Cabin Coffee, Crepes Jeanluc, Rooster Andy's Catering, Timmers Meats, and Roncalli Newman Bread for the World. Rooster Andy's will offer a pulled pork sandwich on a ciabatta roll, homemade beer cheese soup (actually quite good) and cheese cake on a stick. Timmers Meats will offer Italian

beef sandwiches, hot dogs, brats and cold sandwiches and salads. Roncalli Newman will sell strawberry shortcake, ice cream sundaes and root beer floats. Jeanluc will be present both days selling buckwheat and dessert crepes, tartelettes, Canneles de Bordeaux and macaroons.

The work shifts are generally 2 1/2 to 3 hours, beginning at 9:15 A.M. on Saturday and 9:30 on Sunday.
