Don't be fooled by the Workplace Advancement Act, Senate Bill 2200. PLEASE contact our Senators Baldwin and Johnson to oppose this bill. Contrary to it's name it puts forth a very weak solution to the gender pay gap: a very narrow non-retaliation provision that would require workers to use legally 'magic words' when initiating discussions about pay. The bill fails to close may loopholes that have been used for over 40 years in the Equal Pay Act of 1963. Much more work needs to be done to expand the effort to eliminate the gender pay gap in the US.

AAUW's Involvement in the United Nations

As part of her semester volunteer hours with our branch, Olivia researched AAUW's involvement in the United Nations and, with her branch mentor Betty Kruck, developed a fact sheet that was handed out at the November branch meeting. If you missed it, here is the handout:



AAUW is represented in the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs on a special consultative basis. The ECOSOC, initiates reports, makes recommendations, and promotes respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms.



AAUW is working towards ensuring that women's voices are heard in international policy arenas, and to ensure that the advancement of women's rights, gender equality and the empowerment of women are part of the global agenda.



There are five AAUW members that are active representatives in the United Nations: a U.N. representative, 2 youth representatives, 1 former youth ambassador and 1 girl advocate from the Working Group on Girls.



Different issues that the AAUW's U.N. representatives focus on include women's empowerment, human trafficking and increasing women's opportunities in mathematics, science, technology and engineering.



AAUW's representatives plan events, host events for the Commission on the Status of Women, attend briefings, sign on to relevent documents and submit research.
