AAUW National Statement

We stand united against racism.

During this troubling time in our nation's history, I hope you are being kind to yourself and others. It feels almost unbearable to witness the anger and anguish erupting in our cities as we also endure a relentless pandemic and economic downfall. The murder of



George Floyd serves as a tragic reminder of centuries of racism, violence and lack of humanity for Black people. We join the country in mourning his loss as well as the deaths of Ahmaud Arbery, Breonna Taylor and countless other people of color who have been unjustly killed.

But while we are deeply sad, we mustn't feel helpless. Now is the time to fight for justice. Here are some suggestions for how to move forward:

Listen: Understand that many Black and Brown people are struggling with enormous pain and despair. Open your hearts to them and listen when they speak - without expecting them to work for the benefit of your learning.

Learn: Read our <u>recent statement</u> highlighting AAUW's stand against racism and the <u>Washington Post article</u> by 2016–17 AAUW American Fellow alumnae Keisha Blain about the problematic history of policing in this country. AAUW will work to advance the systemic changes needed to create a <u>fairer criminal justice system</u> as a proud member of the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights.

Speak Up: People of color often experience discrimination at the ballot box. This comes in the form of voting restrictions implemented under the guise of preventing "voter fraud," which is extremely rare. With a pivotal election ahead, persuading policymakers to <u>expand voting rights</u> is a powerful way to support marginalized communities. Other issues that disproportionately affect Black women and their families are student-loan debt, pay inequity and the lack of a livable minimum wage — all parts of AAUW's 2020 Gender Agenda you can take action on.

I'd also like to acknowledge that, as an organization, AAUW has its own work to do — and I'm committed to doing it. So I'll be listening, learning and speaking up right alongside you.

Our Scholarship & Grants Process

It all begins with the AAUW-La Crosse leaders who volunteer to serve in various capacities. For 62 years, a succession of members has served as chair of the Art Fair Committee.

Branch members volunteer to serve on the Scholarships and Grants Committee. Between October and December, the committee meets to update the applications, revise the rubrics, create the review process, and volunteer to fulfill various roles. Some committee members research past grant recipients' uses of our awards while others investigate other organizations/agencies with needs that align with AAUW initiatives. We are always looking to assist another group striving to break barriers.

Around January 2, the committee chair confers with the Executive Director at the LCF for the AAUW Fund values; the committee chair uses a long-standing formula to determine the amount available for AAUW distribution.

The committee meets in February to share grantresearch findings, to discuss highest-need organizations/ agencies, and to determine the recipients. The committee then turns to scholarships; six subcommittees review scholarship applications which take a month to complete.

In March, the committee meets to receive the reports of the subcommittees and to make recipient recommendations. These recommendations are reviewed by an independent committee of people not affiliated with our branch. In April, the committee notifies high schools and colleges/universities of our recipients. Committee members volunteer to make presentations to our recipients. And, then, our branch hosts our Scholarship Reception in May.

The committee takes great pride knowing that through our review process we provide support for amazing and deserving students destined to break barriers.

This year, because of our dedicated pandemic response, we could not make in-school presentations or host our reception. Instead, we sent videos to schools to include in their virtual programs. We sent congratulatory letters to our recipients.

The committee welcomes new AAUW members to join us in our exciting work. We want and need new perspectives and energies. Please consider joining us; we promise that you will benefit from great revelations of the good things happening in our community and of the special students who are preparing to assume leadership roles in our society.

In the early years, our branch awarded several \$500 scholarships. In 2020, we awarded \$31,000 – nine \$1,000 grants and twenty-two \$1,000 scholarships.
