# BARRIERS and BIAS The Status of Women in Leadership



In 2016, AAUW published a book examining the gender gap in leadership. Its description of the situation and strategies for narrowing the gap are still relevant.

Barriers and Bias: The Status of Women in Leadership examines the causes of women's underrepresentation in leadership roles in business, politics, and education and suggests what we can do to change the status quo.

There is no shortage of qualified women to fill leadership roles: Women make up almost half of the U.S. labor force. They outnumber men in earning bachelor's and master's degrees and are nearly on par in getting medical and legal degrees. Yet from corporate boardrooms to Congress, from health-care companies to the courts, from non-profit organizations to universities, men are far more likely than women to rise to the highest paying and most prestigious leadership roles.

Despite decades of investment in women's leadership programs, progress in advancing women has stalled. AAUW is committed to closing the gender leadership gap once and for all.

# **Public Policy**

This past weekend, my husband and I drove to Stillwater so I could run a trail race in O'Brien State Park. Neither of us had ever been in that part of Minnesota, and we were amazed by the beauty of the water and the bluffs. We were also amazed by the variety of political signs we saw on our way up north. There were signs pledging allegiance to a former leader, signs vowing that our current leader was NOT their leader and the occasional sign that said "Feel the Bern." The signs that appeared most frequently, however, were those that called to end gerrymandering.

Working for fair maps has been one of AAUW Wisconsin's priorities for quite some time. Even if we manage to stop "cracking" and "packing" our districts, who is still willing to run for office? As of this month, 22 members of Congress have announced they are not seeking reelection. In our own community, Congressman Ron Kind has decided not to seek reelection. And in a study of 700 law students, a professor at Rutgers found that millennials don't want to run for office. Reasons include aversions to raising money, dealing with corruption, and being attacked by the media. Despite the negativity

She Should Run's motto is "If you care, you're qualified!" If you really think public office is not for you, think about encouraging the girls in your life to run for office. She Should Run has a toolkit for that, too!

Where we are now: The Senate and House both voted in August 2021 to advance a budget resolution that includes paid leave and child care in the framework. The Build Back Better Act—the budget resolution in its legislative stage now advances through committee markups. In a significant victory, on September 9 the House Ways and Means Committee approved a universal paid family and medical leave plan.

### August 2021: Lt. Gen. Susan Helms, USAF (Ret.)

Military Women's Memorial (MWM) President Phyllis Wilson sits down with Lt. Gen. Susan Helms, USAF (Ret.) in this recorded video. Not only did Helms serve in the U.S. Air Force, but she was also a NASA astronaut. She has been to space five times for a total of 211 days. She graduated from the



Air Force Academy in 1980 and became a weapons separation engineer and test pilot before joining NASA. While with NASA, she flew aboard the Space Shuttles Endeavor, Discovery, Columbia, and Atlantis, and served aboard the International Space Station. She and Army COL James Voss hold the world record for the longest spacewalk at 8 hours and 56 minutes. She returned to the Air Force in 2002. Helms also served as the 45th Space Wing Commander and was responsible for processing and launching government and commercial satellites. She retired from the Air Force in 2014.
